CARRY FORWARD OF UNSPENT CSR OBLIGATIONS

QUESTION

1782. SHRI RANGASAYEE RAMAKRISHNA:

Will the Minister of CORPORATE AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there is a flaw in the Companies Act, which does not provide for carry forward of unspent CSR obligations;
- (b) whether Public Sector Undertakings are obliged to carry forward of unspent commitments, while Private Sector has no such obligations; and
- (c) whether these anomalies would be corrected by suitable amendments to the Companies Act?

(a) to (c): The Ministry of Corporate Affairs, in its circular dated 12th January 2016, has clarified that, the Board of the Company is free to decide whether any unspent amount from out of the minimum required CSR expenditure is to be carried forward to the next year. This provision is uniformly applicable to all CSR eligible companies including Public Sector Undertakings under the Companies Act, 2013.
